Theme: Jesus Christ, the Son of God (reference Ch. 6)

- I. 6:15-6:30 Welcome Sarah, Jessi, Ali
- Attendance
  - Cell Phones
  - Folders
  - Bible, Journal, Rosary, Faith First books
  - Work on Journal Entry (on the board):
    - What are some different names for Jesus? How do they help me understand him as a person and relate with him?
    - When do I see Jesus in my life?
    - How can we make a story we know so well that it's almost boring (like the Nativity) and make it amazing once more?
  - Scripture verse (on the board): Luke 2:11. For today in the city of David a savior has been born for you who is Messiah and Lord.
- II. 6:30 – 6:35 Opening Prayer Sarah
- Moment of silence to prepare our thoughts and minds for God.
  - Our Father, Hail Mary, Glory Be
  - Jesus Prayer (Lord Jesus Christ, have mercy on me, a sinner.)
- III. 6:35 – 6:45 Readings at Mass Sarah
- Last week, told you there would be a prize for anyone who could tell me how the readings at Mass were linked. Any takers?
- IV. 6:45 – 7:00 Names & Art Sarah
- Why is Jesus called both Son of God and Son of Mary?
  - Assign numbers to each student (1, 2, 3). Give them piece of large paper and coloring supplies. Give them 5-7 minutes to work on making a piece of art that reflects their assigned title. Can reference page 54 of Faith First book.
    - Group 1: Jesus with the title "Messiah"
    - Group 2: Jesus with the title "Christ"
    - Group 3: Jesus with the title "Lord"
  - Hang completed drawings around room, grouped together by title.
  - > What's so important about a name?
    - Names give a sense of mission and roles
    - Jesus means "God saves"
  - What does Jesus' name tell us about him?
    - God is a person (Messiah and Christ)
    - A person is God (Lord)
    - Jesus was fully human AND fully divine. Stubbed his toe even and cried about hurt feelings, even though what we remember most about him is his Passion.

- V. 7:00 – 7:20 Jesus in Scripture Sarah
- Use groupings from earlier.
    - Group 1: Matthew 1:18-25
    - Group 2: Luke 2:1-14
    - Group 3: Colossions 1:15-20
  - Volunteer from each group read aloud.
  - Discussion after Gospel readings:
    - What was happening?
    - What words do you hear being used? How are they important?
    - God becoming man = Incarnation
    - How are they different?
  - Discussion after Colossions reading:
    - This is a hymn of the early Church
    - When do we sing hymns at Mass? Why do we sing hymns?
- VI. 7:20 – 7:25 Closing Prayer Parent or Sarah
- Moment of silence to gather thoughts
  - Any special intentions?
  - Decade of scriptural rosary (Nativity)
- VII. 7:25 – 7:30 Clean-up & Dismissal Sarah, Jessi, Ali
