- IV. 6:45 – 6:50 The Lord's Prayer Sarah
- What is the Lord's Prayer? (can reference Youcat 511, 512)
 - St. Thomas Aquinas called the Lord's Prayer, also called the Our Father) the "most perfect prayer" and Tertullian called it "the summary of the whole Gospel." (reference Youcat 514)
 - Early Christians prayed it three times a day
 - How did the Our Father come about?
 - Read together: Matthew 6:6-15
- V. 6:50 – 7:10 Word Cloud Prayer Sarah
- Divide class into 5 teams
 - Give each team materials (Our Father word page, large paper, etc.) and have them arrange a "word cloud" on the floor or table.

- Should discuss which words should be featured most prominently and how they'll do that
- Make a word cloud poster that emphasizes those particular words using brighter colors, larger writing, etc.
- End by having each group present their word cloud to the class and explain how they decided which words to feature

The Lord's Prayer (reference Ch. 26)

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The LORD'S PRAYER is the prayer Jesus gave us when the disciples asked him how to pray. It is also called the OUR FATHER.

The words to this prayer are:

OUR FATHER WHO ART IN HEAVEN, HALLOWED BE THY NAME. THY KINGDOM COME, THY WILL BE DONE, ON EARTH AS IT IS IN HEAVEN. GIVE US THIS DAY OUR DAILY BREAD AND FORGIVE US OUR TRESPASSES, AS WE FORGIVE THOSE WHO TRESPASS AGAINST US. LEAD US NOT INTO TEMPTATION, BUT DELIVER US FROM EVIL. AMEN.

The early Christians prayed this prayer 3 times a day.
